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Adelsheim Vineyard to Release Second Vintage of Limited-Edition Artist Series Rosé Wine

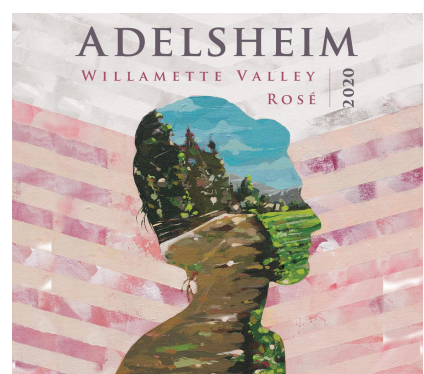
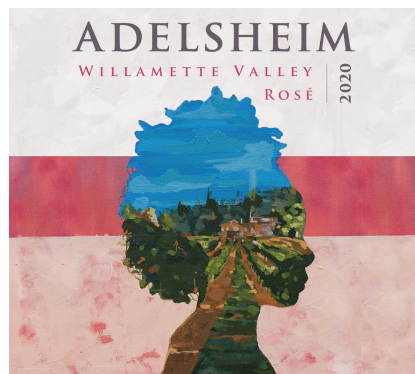
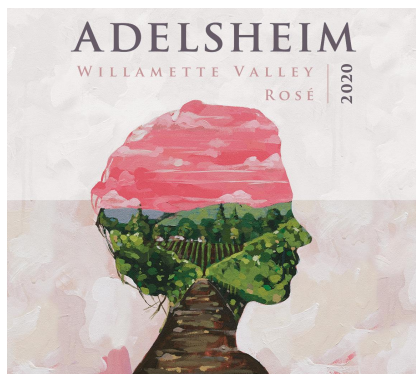
2020 vintage features original label artwork by Portland-based artist, Jeremy Okai Davis

(March. 1, 2021) - [Adelsheim Vineyard](#), one of the Willamette Valley’s founding wineries and the Chehalem Mountains’ first winery, will release their second “Artist Series” wine, a 2020 Willamette Valley Rosé, whose label features commissioned work by Portland-based artist, Jeremy Okai Davis.



Since its founding in 1971, Adelsheim has been synonymous with the iconic illustrated wine labels of co-founder, Ginny Adelsheim. The winery continues that artistic heritage with the second release of their “Artist Series” Rosé. Since 2019, each vintage of Adelsheim’s Willamette Valley Rosé features original artwork by a talented, local artist who demonstrates the spirit of Oregon’s founding wineries--that to create something great, you must push boundaries and take risks. For the 2020 vintage, Jeremy Okai Davis created such an incredible selection of designs that Adelsheim could not choose just one ... so they created three! The 2020 Adelsheim “Artist Series” Rosé features a trio of collectible labels in

Jeremy’s unique style, showcasing three of Adelsheim’s estate vineyards: Quarter Mile Lane, Ribbon Springs, and Bryan Creek.



“It was such an honor to be selected to create an Adelsheim ‘Artist Series’ Rosé label in their 50th year,” said Davis. “I was inspired by the original portraits of the early labels by Ginny Adelsheim. There was a quiet strength in the subjects that made me think of the land Adelsheim inhabits. Within each portrait silhouette, I wanted to incorporate those lush rolling vineyard hills and pay homage to the history of the landscape.”
